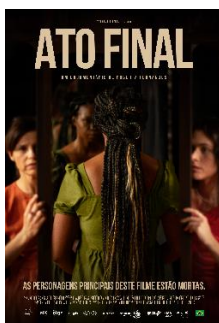
Presentation

Human Rights Day is celebrated annually on December 10th due to the adoption by the General Assembly of the United Nations (UN) of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), in 1948 (<https://eurocid.mne.gov.pt/eventos/dia-dos-direitos-humanos>).

Aligned with the principles and values of the Council of Europe and enshrined in the European Convention on Human Rights (Open Council of Europe Academic Networks - OCEAN), we have fulfilled our commitment to disseminate, train and inform, within the scope of the curricula, about the purposes defended by this convention.

Thus, based on the appeals made by the Council of Europe Convention on Preventing and Combating Violence Against Women and Domestic Violence (Istanbul Convention), the screening will take place on December 13th, at 11am in the Fernando Pessoa University Auditorium. from the film «Ato Final» (Documentary/color/73 minutes/2023) by Roberta Fernandes, which will be followed by a period of debate.

About the movie



The main characters in this film are deceased, as they were victims of their partners. There are four victims per day in Brazil. To tell their stories, three actresses are challenged to experience, on stage, the emotions of women who intimately experience the risk of death. Meanwhile, a group of femicide survivors fight to save other women trapped in abusive relationships. Different narratives that come together in an outcry, because silence also kills women every day. Launched in Brazil on November 16, 2023.

Roberta Fernandes| Journalist and film director, Roberta's work is directly linked to social issues. She won the 2018 Canal Brasil Short Film Grand Prize with “Se Você contar”, a film about child sexual abuse that participated in festivals in Brazil and abroad. She also directed the documentaries “Congo Santo” and “Acerca da Pele” for television. In 2023, she debuted her first feature film, “Ato Final”, a documentary about feminicide.



Rodrigo Cerqueira| Journalist, PhD in History and documentary filmmaker. He worked as a reporter for the newspaper “O Globo” between 1999 and 2003, and as a teacher and researcher between 2005 and 2017. He directed the TV series “Relatos Ausentes” and “Sou Casaca”, shown on Canal Futura, and co-directed the documentaries “Congo Santo” and “Acerca da Pele”. He served as editor and executive producer on several other productions, including the feature film “Ato Final”.



Renato Essenfelder| Brazilian journalist, columnist, writer and university professor with post-doctorate in Communication and Arts at the University of Beira Interior (Covilhã, Portugal). Graduated in Journalism from the Federal University of Paraná (UFPR), has a specialization in Film and TV Directing at ESAP (Escola Superior Artística do Porto, Portugal), a master's degree in Portuguese at PUC-SP and a PhD in Communication Sciences from the School of Communications and Arts at the University of São Paulo (ECA-USP). He worked as a reporter and editor for the newspaper “Folha de S. Paulo” and as editor-in-chief for the newspaper “Metro”. Since 2014, he has been writing culture and behavior chronicles for the website of the newspaper “O Estado de S. Paulo”. Currently, he is a professor and pedagogical coordinator for the PhD in Communication Sciences at the University Fernando Pessoa, in Porto, the city where he lives.
